GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

To provide an opportunity for contestants to:

- 1) demonstrate skill and creativity in performing a braid and/or an up-style;
- 2) prepare, organize, and work within the time required;
- 3) maintain sanitary working conditions;
- 4) demonstrate professionalism in overall appearance.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE EVALUATED:

Junior: The grade 10 and 11 competition will be based on creative impression and ability. This will use the skills of braiding, weaving and knotting performed on a long hair mannequin. The student must braid 75% of the mannequin head.

Intermediate: The level of this competition will allow the stylists to demonstrate technical skills and creative ability with an up-style performed on a long hair mannequin.

CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS:

Clean and comfortable work attire and footwear must be worn. See "judging criteria and contest rules" for overall appearance information.

EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS:

Supplied by the committee:

- The committee will supply tables, mirrors, mannequins and mannequin stands, extension cords, etc.
- The length of all mannequin hair will be 18"
- Hands must be washed (or sanitized) before starting the competition. The committee will supply a large bottle of sanitizer.

Supplied by the contestant:

- Contestant must supply their own tools and products (no sharing) Suggested supplies: professional products, Barbicide spray, bobby pins, elastics, spray bottle, curling iron, flat iron, hot rollers, tail combs, sectioning clips, etc.
- Ornamentation (i.e. complements the design, does not cover more than 1/8 head, demonstrates pre-planning and creativity – does not include hair extensions and hair pieces)
- Professional styling products must be used (color sprays are not permitted)
- All equipment and station must be sanitary prior to competition and maintained throughout

JUDGING CRITERIA AND CONTEST RULES:

Judging criteria will be based upon the contest objectives listed in this document. In addition the contestant will be evaluated on the following:

- The contestant started on time
- The contestant completed on time
- The contestant remained focused (no visiting)
- The contestant came prepared (tools, product, etc.)
- The contestant maintained sanitary equipment and work station
- In the braiding competition, 75% of the head must be braided.
- The contestant demonstrated professionalism in overall appearance, as in tasteful attire and make-up (no exposed midriffs, spaghetti straps, low cut tops, shorts, jeans, mini-skirts, etc.)

Time allowed for completion:

- 1.5 hours for up-style
- 1.5 hours for braid
